DUTIES

Reporting to the Chair of Information Security and IT Operations, the Instructor(s) will teach both online and on-campus courses for Applied Computer Education programs. This Instructor(s) will develop and/or teach courses in Security and IT Operations. The Instructor(s) may also be required to teach other courses; if required, time for professional development to learn relevant skills will be provided. Additional duties include collaborating with peers to update courses, contributing to the learning environment of the department by committing to ongoing professional development to stay current with industry practices, supporting the learning of peers, and participating in departmental and College projects and committees. Solid technical expertise paired with strong communication and intercultural skills are required to inspire students in a blended learning environment.
